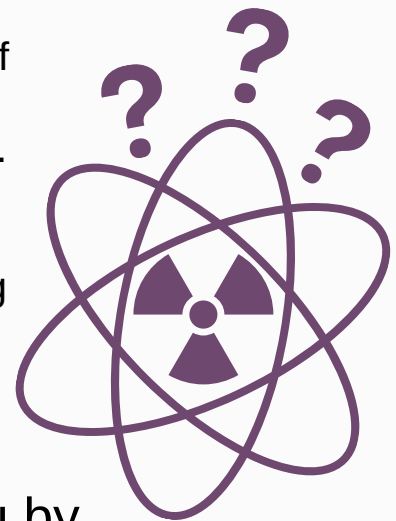
The Debaters:
