

34 Years Without Justice: Community Calls for Renewed Investigation into the Murder of Susan "Su" Taraskiewicz.

Media invited to attend September 12 anniversary vigil as renewed awareness campaign launches across Massachusetts.

EAST BOSTON, Mass. — Thirty-four years after the murder of Susan 'Su' Taraskiewicz, Susan's family will join retired investigators and community supporters at Constitution Beach to honor her life, remember the 34th anniversary of her murder, and renew the public call for justice.

On **Saturday, September 12, 2026**, supporters will gather at **Constitution Beach in East Boston** to honor Susan's life and remind the public that her killer has never been brought to justice.

The anniversary vigil will also launch a statewide public awareness campaign designed to generate fresh media attention, encourage new leads, and remind the public that Susan's murder remains unsolved.

ABOUT SUSAN TARASKIEWICZ

- Susan "Su" Taraskiewicz was 27 years old and worked as a baggage supervisor for Northwest Airlines at Logan International Airport, becoming one of the first women to hold that position.
- Before her murder, she endured documented workplace harassment after cooperating during an investigation into a large employee credit card theft operation.
- She disappeared after leaving work on **September 12, 1992**.
- Two days later, her body was discovered in the trunk of her Toyota Tercel at Bravo Automotive in Revere.
- Despite local, state, and federal investigations spanning more than three decades, including multiple grand juries, no one has ever been charged in Susan's murder.

The Billboard That a Community Never Forgot

For decades, thousands of commuters traveling through Greater Boston passed a billboard asking a simple question:

"Did you see Susan or her car?"

The billboard became one of the most recognizable reminders of an unsolved murder in Massachusetts. For many, it ensured that Susan’s name—and the search for justice—was never forgotten.

As part of the 34th Anniversary Awareness Campaign, organizers are working with Clear Channel Outdoor in hopes that a billboard will once again be donated to help renew public awareness and encourage anyone with information to come forward.
